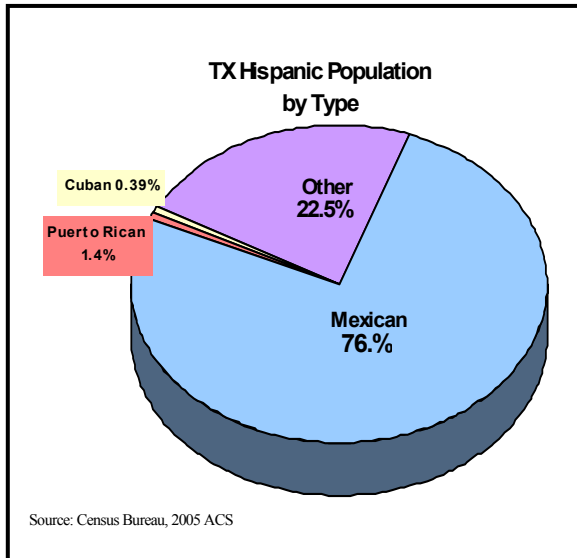


Hispanic Origin, Nativity and Geographic Profiles



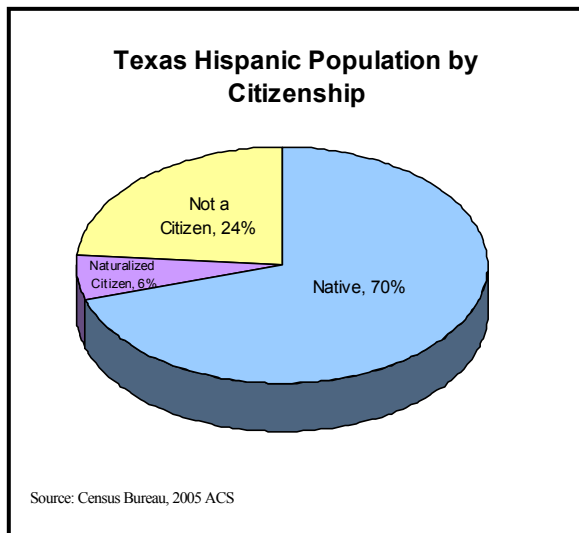
Texas ranks 3rd in the nation in size of Foreign-born population but 2nd in population change in Foreign-Born over last five years.¹

Hispanics of Mexican-Origin are the largest and most predominant in Texas.
